Student Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the graduate certificate in Historic Preservation, the graduate will be able to do the following:

Content:

• Identify, evaluate, and apply core concepts, principles, processes, and methodologies of the discipline of historic preservation.

Critical Thinking:

• Identify, document, and evaluate the historical significance of cultural heritage resources

Communication:

• Craft historic and cultural heritage preservation documents that meet the Secretary of Interior standards for historic preservation.

Integrity/Values:

• Articulate and apply professional ethical practices as defined by the American Historical Association's Statement on Standards of Professional Conduct and the National Council on Public History Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct..

Assessment of Student Learning Outcomes

Students in the Historic Preservation Certificate are assessed directly through a capstone experience that is evaluated by an objective rubric based on the Secretary of the Interior Standards for documenting historic properties. Indirect measures include satisfaction surveys of graduates and participants.
