Develop population-based public health policies, programs, projects or interventions utilizing budgetary tools and resource management while incorporating knowledge of public health organizations and systems.

Assessment of Student Learning Outcomes

Graduate students in the Master of Public Health program will acquire advanced skills and knowledge that enable them to enter the public health profession or pursue additional graduate studies at the

doctoral level. Direct assessment in this program is conducted using examinations, short essays that incorporate public health principles, theories and concepts to problem solving, semester projects, an objective comprehensive exam, and evaluation of student performance in the Practicum in Public Health courses which are the required culminating experiences at the end of a student's program of study.
