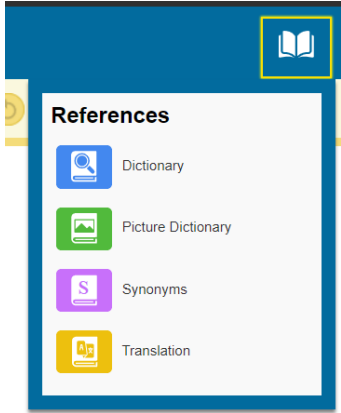
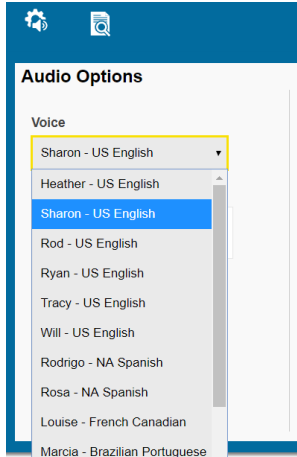


Vocabulary Tools with Kurzweil 3000

References	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Dictionary</i>- Place cursor before a word. Choose a dictionary from the dropdown • <i>Picture Dictionary</i>- Place cursor before a word • <i>Synonyms</i>- Select a word or phrase in the text • <i>Translation</i> (powered by Google Translate)- Select a word or phrase in the text. A readable dialog box will pop up allowing you to select the desired language for detection and translation 	
Change the Reading Voice to Match the Document	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kurzweil 3000 includes reading voices for 11 different languages: English, Spanish, French, German, Italian, Portuguese, Dutch, Swedish, Danish, Norwegian, and Finnish • Open a document • In the “Audio Options” menu change the voice to one that matches the text of the file 	
Add Language Tags to Image Documents	<p>For documents in multiple languages, use the “Language” button to tag the reading language in an image file. A reading voice matching the language you have assigned will automatically read the text</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Click the “Tools” menu and choose the “Language” button 	

- Each reading language has a designated color
- Click on a language on the right, then click and drag across the text you want to tag. The one you have selected will be marked with a check and an oval outline
- When you are done tagging, click “Save”



Customize Default Voices for Language Tagging

- In the “Audio Options” menu, choose “Multi-Language Voice Preferences”
- For each language, set your preferred voice and adjust the reading speed
