Introduction by Senator Arnold

Introduction by Senator Lyons:

Hi all. Just going to post all of my thoughts and ideas here. Could Vice President Gardner or someone else read them aloud? I apologize for my lack of a mic, I am at my mother's house helping her through some things and I do not have a microphone here, but for future meetings I will be at home and have access to a mic.1. DTA / DSA + more -I'd like to add a 3rd category to this process. Right now we have the Distinguished Teaching Awards which recognize outstanding faculty and the Distinguished Staff Awards which recognize outstanding staff. I would like to add DPA for outstanding personnel that do not fall into those categories. This includes OPS workers, bus drivers, cafeteria workers, bookstore workers, etc. I don't know about y'all, but everytime I go to the Nautilus Market, there's 1 or 2 workers that always check in on me. They go



above and beyond. They deserve an opportunity to be recognized just as much as someone with a doctorate or master's degree. Imagine how much it would mean to them to receive a plaque to hang on their wall at home. Candidate Review Packets Right now my understanding is that a lot of this debate as to who receives which award happens in the committee meetings. That's fine and it has worked. But I would like to create packets that have all of the information that only committee members see, and I'd like to share those first with the Senate and also to post them online for transparency purposes. I think this is a good way to highlight the process more and to better pass down how decisions are made. When it's narrowed down to 2 or 3 candidates for the award, especially, that is when we would be coming to Senate and presenting these packets, so that Senators can chime in and offer further input for the University Affairs Committee. Expanding Duties Right now, from years of being in SGA and having followed the activities of the University Affairs Committee closely, I have seen that the spring semester is its busiest time. That is when the DTA / DSA process typically occurs. During the fall, it's more focused on the Green Fee, and there's a lot of down time. I would like to look at other ways that we can get these Senators involved and to give them more duties to handle. This is a process I'd really like to have with the new Senators on the committee once selected, to sit down as a unit and work thru our statutes. Recovering from Covid-19 As outgoing University Affairs Chair Miller noted earlier, the committee is in a really unique position right now, because of the Covid-19 crisis. This year's DTA/DSA program has been temporarily paused and will need to be completed upon the seating of the new committee. I would like to spend the summer meeting remotely with my committee members to hash out final details and to move forward with finishing up this year's DTA/DSA process. That way, we can roll into the fall already done and caught up, to continue with normal business as planned.
