High Impact Program

Description of Executive Mentor Program:

- Undergraduate and graduate students
- Partnered one-on-one with local business executives
- Network, learn from experience, and establish professional connections.
- Mentor serves as a coach and role model
- Share personal, business and professional experience, knowledge and skills to help the student prepare for and be ready to enter the business world.

Goals & Objectives:

- Prepare students for successful careers in business by integrating academic learning with real-world experiences.
- 100 participants (50 students matched with
 50 mentors for a year.)

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Matching Mentors & Students

- Mentors are paired with students based on academic backgrounds, career fields, common interests, and/or availability.
- Students and Mentors commit to meet 1 2 hours per month throughout the academic school year.


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High Impact Measurable Outcomes
