

Identify a funding program

Submit Proposal Request to RAE

 MyUWF → Service Desk → Proposal Request



Review RFP for requirements of program and proposal



Revise project budget



Write the proposal

- Collaborators
- Evaluator
- Hanover Research



Develop project budget



Develop scope of project



Submit proposal text to RAE

- Final check against RFP
- Formatting confirmation



RAE submits proposal to sponsor






Proposal decision to PI and RAE











Guiding Principles for Proposal Preparation

How to write a proposal that will (probably) not get funded




Guiding Principles for Proposal Preparation

- 1. Shoehorn your research proposal into a funding program with which it is not **aligned**
- 2. Do not **read the RFP** to identify the key requirements of the funding program
- 3. Do not engage collaborators (a) early or (b) in a meaningful way. Reviewers LOVE when your collaboration is represented only in a letter attached as an appendix
- 4. Start at the last minute
- 5. Please do not **let RAE know** that you are submitting a proposal until the last minute. They cannot provide any assistance anyway and submitting a proposal is as simple as one-click email.
